Every year the Indy chapter is well represented at the annual Drag race held at the Mid Michigan Motorplex in Stanton, Michigan. This drag race is a big national event and attracts racers and media from all over the country and Canada. For the racers it's a culmination of a year of preparation and for the Studebaker spectators a chance to see how our favorite make stands up against all the other fastest cars of the muscle car era.

Eleven Studebakers showed up to participate in this year's race, a new record. Three Indy Chapter members made the trip with our cars as we have done for the last several years along with several other chapter members.

Ted Harbit had his 1963 R3 Lark out for the very first time with the new R3 engine sitting in between the frame rails. It had only been in the car long enough to know it would run before taking it up a few days early to be the only car of any make to be Certified for the 2010 race. Ted fought a number of issues with the car but had it all come together at the last minute to make its successful debut.

The certification is done to insure the car is stock according to the standards set by the sanctioning body based on the maker of the car, the Studebaker Corporation's original standards. A partial tear down of the engine is done and measurements are taken of the engine. Ted reassembles it under the watchful eye of an inspector to make sure it's as inspected for the race. Ted is well within the specs for an R3, in fact he could make power changes that would improve the car and still be legal. It is then certified as stock. Ted does this to quell any arguments that may be presented as to the cars performance. It's hard to believe but some people may be surprised at the tremendous performance a Studebaker engine is capable of.

Richard and Rose Poe (that would be us) returned with our 1963 R1 Lark. We bring the car to the races to have fun of course, but also to dispute the theory that Studebakers need a supercharger to be competitive. This year we worked on the chassis setup to make improvements to help the car at the starting line and the first 60'. This is critical to doing well and preserving suspension parts. I was able to pull out faster at the line than much more powerful cars and was pleased with the improvements.

Our beloved President and First Lady Chuck and Linda Kern had their 1963 R2 Avanti that is skillfully prepared by John Kern back again. It also was on track and ran about as it did last year. John has done an amazing job on the car and Chuck drives it to its optimum performance every year.

I kid with Chuck and John but they are a great team and it is something they enjoy and do well together. I have run Chuck at the track and to race with him you need to be at your best, he will be tough at the tree every time. Other racers tell me the same thing. John is always working to give his dad a good car to race, checking every detail, and keeping dad focused. I'm always impressed with the two of them.

Unfortunately the race was a rainout, but we got qualifying passes in on Friday. Ted's car was fast and has not yet come close to its peak. He would have raced a 455 Buick on Saturday. Ted needed to get some time on the track and he did that but hasn't had it opened up all the way yet. It ran it's quickest ever, but stay tuned.

My R1 would have run against a SS Chevelle with a 107ci advantage over the Lark. Our car ran as expected and we had our best ever 60' times for this track. That is the time it takes to travel from a dead stop to through the first 60' and the car did it in 2.024 seconds and I would have done it even faster on Saturday if we had not been rained out. That is 0 to 34.33 MPH in 2.024 seconds!

Chuck ran solid all day and was satisfied that the car performed as it has in the past. He feels his scheduled opponent, a top performing 1970 390 AMX, would have pushed him to a new level in the heat of competition. We were all disappointed we didn't get to race in the shoot-out but what a great time we had with all the other racers and Studebaker group that were in attendance. Bench racing and swapping ideas is a big part of this whole thing. If you ever come up, stop and talk a while with

the racers.

We all missed Dale and Barb McPhearson. Dale is on his road to recovery and will be home soon. We have more on that later. Now it's all about getting ready for the 2011 race, see you all there!

**SPARK PLUG WIRES**

Something that is overlooked in the maintenance of your Studebaker is spark plug wires. If they haven't been replaced for some time (or maybe never), the rubber insulation will develop cracks and allow the spark to jump to a metal part on the engine rather than going across the spark plug gap as it should. This causes the engine to misfire. In other words, your Studebaker will not run properly.

If there is any question as to how old the wires are, replace them. Also it's best to replace them especially if you've changed to a higher output ignition.
