Studebaker Showroom Banners From Snider Auto Service

The 1963 Studebaker showroom banners displayed at our January 27 Indy Chapter meeting at The Pit Stop in Brownsburg are not reproductions. Nor are they swap meet refugees with an unknown provenance. Rather, they are original banners with a unique history.

The two banners displayed at The Pit Stop are among a set of showroom from the four directly of Snider Service at Indianapolis' West 38th and North Illinois streets, one of the city's authorized Studebaker dealers in 1963. I also have original banner listing the Avanti USAC Bonneville record runs. The USAC/Avanti banner has been reproduced for Avanti fans.

My fourth showroom banner is the 1963 Gran Turismo Hawk version, proudly proclaiming it to be, "America's

All four had been displayed in


Snider Auto Service showroom during the 1963 model year. At age 17, I used to hang around Snider and became good friends with Sales Manager John Knapp, shown here in his office in 1963. At the end of the 1963 model year, when John was replacing the banners with 1964 versions, he asked if I'd like to have the '63 banners he was taking down! Woo-hoo; he didn't have to ask twice...and I'm sure my Mom was delighted when I brought them home and hung them in my

room. Or not.

Between Purdue, bachelorhood, marriage, and "married with children," I've moved six times since acquiring the banners, but have taken them along with each move. All are in fairly good condition for

being 55 years old. I've made sure they were not exposed to direct sunlight and have kept them unrolled, hanging vertically, so as not to become wrinkled.

They are a nice memory of the days spent at Snider drooling over new Studebakers and happy-face press releases from South Bend. When John Knapp was out and about elsewhere in the dealership, he didn't sitting at his desk, nosing through the mind mv dispatches from South Bend. Can you imagine a 17-year-old youngster being given free reign today in the Sales Manager's office at one of today's mega dealers?







Drive-Im Movies Part One: YESTERDAY

Studebakers and Drive-In Movie Theaters were a match made in Heaven! I'm sure that many of you reading this article can remember driving a Studebaker and sitting in its large comfortable interior while enjoying the latest Hollywood creation.

My memories of going to the Drive-In Theater began with me in the back seat and my parents in the front seat. But once I hit the magic age of 15 (and began dating Dave), I moved to the MIDDLE of the front seat...right next to the handsome raven-haired driver of a 1950 black and white Studebaker Champion.



As shown in this picture, it was not uncommon for youngsters to enjoy both the movie and the dating "action" in the car behind them.

Now for a little Drive-In History

The world's first Drive-In Theater was invented in Richard Hollingshead's backyard in the early 1930s. Richard nailed a screen to a tree and used a 1928 Kodak projector on the hood of his car and a radio behind the screen for sound. In 1933, Richard opened his "real" Drive-In Theater in Camden, New Jersey. Admission was 25¢ and the sound was projected via a directional audio system by RCA Victor. This worked great for the people in the cars, but not so good for the Theater's neighbors.

The invention of in-car speakers helped to make Drive-In Theaters more neighbor friendly, and soon thousands of theaters were popping up

across the country.

Over the years, there have many

stories about people trying to sneak past the Drive-In's ticket booth without paying for a ticket for EVERYONE riding in the car. According to these urban legends, kids would hide in the car's trunk, lay on the floor under a blanket, or sneak in through the bushes and jump into their buddy's car after he was parked. To garner more family business and try to eliminate the teenage



sneaking, many theaters started promoting Dollar Nights.

After doing some research, I discovered that South Bend, Indiana was home to at least one Drive-In Movie Theater. It was opened in September 1953



by L. Cochovetry
as the Moonlite
Outdoor Theatre
with a single
screen. In 1961,
Loews took over
operations,
upgraded to twin
screens and it was
renamed the

Chippewa Twin Drive-In. (Located at 500 W. Chippewa Ave.) Car capacity was 600 cars. (Side note: Before it was demolished around 1988, it had switched to showing Adult XXX movies.)

Yes, going to the Drive-In in a Stude was fun.
Sadly, over the years, MANY theaters closed. But don't give up hope for another trip to the Drive-In.
