Grille marked Studebaker's '55 offerings

"You drive the real pace-setter when you go Studebaker! This far-ahead car has won 36 International Style Awards."

In 1953, Studebaker had dramatically restyled all its new cars, and in 1955 the most noticeable change was the bold new grille, heavily framed in

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

chrome and encompassing the parking/turn-signal lights.

The President model series returned. It had been missing from the Studebaker line since the last straight-eight Studebaker was made in 1942. Studebaker had built only sixes from 1946 to 1950, but had included an overhead-valve V-8 in its selection since 1951.

The 55 model series: Champion 6 (Custom, Deluxe, Regal); Commander V-8 (Custom, Deluxe, Regal); President V-8 (Deluxe, State).

The State President lineup in-



cluded a two-door hardtop coupe in both the standard (\$2,456) and special 1955½ sports Speedster versions. The Speedster cost \$3,252 and up, depending on extras.

State President sedans had gold-plated hardware, with goldplated Mylar plastic trim plates behind door hardware. The lower section of the instrument panel was gold finished, while the radio grille was in gold, with a chrome frame. Power brakes were optional, as were power steering, power seats, electric window lifts and air conditioning. Available overdrive gave a fourth speed forward and enhanced Studebaker's fuel economy. A 1955 Commander V-8 averaged 27.4 miles per gallon in the 1,323mile Mobil Economy Run.

No convertibles were available, but there was a station wagon in addition to the coupes, sedans and hardtop convertibles.

Over the past few months you have probably seen the news of the Studebaker event in Hope, Indiana, during our 52nd annual Hope Heritage Days festival. I want to take this opportunity to provide some more details and offer some resources to make it a great experience for everyone.

Heritage Days is known for its uncomplicated, inexpensive family fun and helping the community by raising over \$175,000 each year for its school, civic, and church organizations. Free entertainment is provided over the last full weekend of September with the Saturday night concert and giant fireworks show and Sunday parade taking center stage.

This year we wanted to involve and benefit our new local business owner Jim Lime and Studebaker International by hosting a Saturday car show that will give priority to the Studebaker community. As an added feature, we have partnered with the Indiana Historical Society to bring its Auto Indiana History on Wheels exhibit to Hope for all three days. This is a 53-foot doubleexpandable semi-trailer which touches on the history of more than 100 Indiana auto makers and delves into the lives of many great Hoosier innovators and inventors. We have partnered with local hotels to provide discounts and encourage you to stay for the Sunday events.

The car show will be located near the heart of the festival at 455 Jackson Street with food, entertainment, and restrooms only a short walk away. Spots for this show will be given on a reservation basis only to assure that Studebakers are given priority. I will be taking the reservations personally at 812-371-0472 or <u>the5deans@gmail.com</u> The car show has a limit of 54 total spaces and a deadline of September 10th before

other vehicle makes will be allowed. A small entry fee of only \$7 per car is needed to cover awards.






The Overshadowed Police Car
