


### A Little Info From Susan Lusted

Less than 90 days in and plans for the 2021 SDC International Meet (IM) are coming together nicely. In January the contract will be signed with the Marion County Fairgrounds. The contract must be approved by the International Committee (IMC) and then be signed by the SDC President. The hotels being utilized have been chosen and notified, room rates will not be finalized until 12 months before the event. A budget is being formed and will need to be submitted on a quarterly basis to the IMC. The daily schedule has a rough draft and we will continue to add events in the future. We are doing very well but, we need a few more key people to chair a position on our meet committee. In this issue you will find a list of positions and their chair people or they are marked OPEN. We hope you volunteer to help in any or several of the areas needed.

I am very pleased to announce that Darlene Williams has volunteered to be Co-Chairperson. Darlene has over 35 years of management and planning experience. Her attention to detail is much needed, as I sometimes tend to "just fly by the seat of my pants".

Annette Wheatcraft has volunteered to act as our Treasurer for the IM, Annette is a CPA and has worked in accounting for over 30 years. It was decided that the Indy Chapter would set up a separate checking account for the IM Annette and Tom Flynn (our chapter treasurer) will both be signors on the account. The account should be up and running in January.

Becky Griffith volunteered to be the secretary, Becky will report to both membership and IMC of our progress as we meet. There will be several meetings that will occur outside of chapter meetings as we move closer to the dates.

Some are asking, "When is the meet and what is planned so far....". The official dates are September 8-11, 2021. This is Labor Day week, Monday (Labor Day) we will be setting up the meetings room with chairs and a stage. Vendor tables and chairs will also be put in place. We are hoping to use a Boy Scout troop for the manual labor, with a donation of course.

Tuesday will be vendor swap meet move in as well as registration for early arrivals with evening social event yet to be confirmed.

Wednesday is a big day full of events, the annual SDC Board of Directors meeting and RACING! Our guests will have the opportunity to visit the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, tour the museum and drive the track with photo opportunities. We are working on a race shop tour nearby and finish the day with racing (viewing or participating) at Lucas Oil Park in the evening. The latter is not a sanctioned SDC event but has occurred at several International meets. Jeff Westcott and wife Kathy are chairing the day's events short of the board meeting.

Thursday and Friday will be concourse along with several meetings/seminars as well as a "Ladies Tea/Luncheon" which Bernice Snider & Kathy Westcott are working on. We are also working on a "Casino" trip to Shelbyville, In should our visitors wish to go. Bus transportation supplied by the Casino.

Saturday will be a large car show open to the public. Current plans are for Studebakers in one area and a separate vintage car "cruise in" nearby. Concourse awards for SDC will be held in early afternoon and a farewell catered Bar B Que following. We are currently looking for a civic group or Boy Scout group to help us with the parking for this event.

All week there will be ample opportunity for our guests to visit sites and attractions around central Indiana. We will have a meet booklet highlighting places to visit as well as maps to get there. • 1937 - First to install double walled boxes on pick-up trucks.

- 1940 First auto manufacturer to win all three divisions of the Gilmore Economy Run!
- 1948 First to use nylon upholstery.
- 1953 First to introduce modern American family sports car styling.
- 1962 First (with the Avanti) to install a built-in roll bar in a passenger car.

Whether in our personal lives or in the history of our favorite automobile, it's always fun to celebrate our 'FIRSTS"!

• 1930 - First to use thin steel-backed main bearings, adopted from airplane design.
