After lunch, Nancy opened the meeting and informed the club that Darlene Williams recently learned that she is facing serious health issues and is going to have to back out of serving as Co-Chair (with Joe Bacon) for our 2021 International Meet. A card was passed around for all to sign and wish Darlene well.

One new member, Victor Melchiorre, and one guest, Casey Elmore, were introduced.

OLD BUSINESS: Nancy mention that dues are still due. If you can't remember if you have paid for 2020, check with Tom Flynn.

NEW BUSINESS: Bob Palma reported to the club about the recent radio broadcast on Hoosier History Live. He moved that the club pay the \$100 cost of an Indy Chapter Ad that is broadcast at the beginning of the show. Motion seconded by Jeff Westcott. Motion passed unanimously. Mike Baker said that the broadcast interviewer did an excellent job and he proposed that we send our newsletter to him.

Next, we were shown a sample of the vests that club members that will be wearing at the 2021 International Meet when they are working. The vest is a black and white check with a black lining. A patch will be placed on the front or the back of the vest (placement to be determined later). Those in attendance tried on demo vests. Those who were unable to attend the February meeting, demo vests will also be available to try on at the March meeting. Nancy plans to put vest details in the newsletter.

2021 MEET REPORT: Joe passed around the working drafts for the meet advertising. All agreed the design looks good.

Next Berniece Snider reported that she and her committee had made the arrangements for the Ladies Tea event. Ladies will ride a bus to the Copper Kettle for the luncheon.

Mike Baker stated that the Avanti Club will be selecting a hotel as their headquarters. They will conduct their meetings, etc. at their host hotel. He inquired as to where the SDC meetings and workshops were planned to be held. Joe said that Swap Meet, Judging, meetings, workshops, Concours, etc. would all be held at the Fairgrounds.

Jeff Westcott reported on finalizing the Indianapolis Racing Day. There will be opportunity for people to drive their Studebakers around the track and visit the Museum. Tom Lawlis is working on setting up group tours of the Dellara Racing facility in downtown Speedway. Later that evening there will be Drag Racing @ Raceway Park. It is shaping up to be ONE day with THREE activities...all on the Westside of Indianapolis. It was determined that people may register for one, two, or all three events.

A question was raised about whether Indy Chapter members will have to pay to register for the 2021 Meet. The answer is YES.

It was pointed out that the Antique Studebaker Club will be holding their annual Meet on Monday and Tuesday (of our Meet Week). It was therefore hoped that our 3-event Racing Day could be scheduled for Wednesday...thus enabling these people to attend by extending their stay by one day.

Because the restaurant was preparing to close for the day, Andy Swartz quickly moved to adjourn. Motion was unanimously seconded.

Nancy reported that treasurer, Tom Flynn, said there are 65 paid SDC members suggesting that mailing the renewal worked.


Charlie reported that April and June were still open for meets. But then Mike Baker announced he had arranged an event in June. It was reported that the

Larry & I go back many years. I have no idea when we first met, but he made a lasting impression on me. When I became Zone Coordinator back in 2000 he reached out to me reminding me that I lived in and now represented (in his opinion) the best Zone in all of SDC. He offered to help me in any way he could. And he meant it! When Leigh Morris decided not to run in 2002, Larry asked me if I was going to run for the position, I told him that I didn't feel comfortable in that position yet as I thought I needed more experience where I was. He said he was interested in running, but if I wanted it, he would yield to me. He ran and was elected and served until the "term limits" came in and I won the election in 2014. Larry was always there with help and advice. He and Pat were at all of the SDC meets until just a few years ago. Lynda and I had a really good chat with him in Tacoma during the SDC meet there & I learned a few more interesting details about the early years of the SDC and some of the things that Larry was involved with. He was SDC membership director from 1972-1976, handled the SDC roster from 1972 - 1980, Was TURNING WHEELS Editor from 1972 - 1992, ran the SDC advertising from 1072 -1982, Was the TURNING WHEELS "club writer" from 1992 - 2008, was the TURNING WHEELS publication Director from 1992 - 2008, and Larry was our SDC copyright and legal advice guy for many years.

We owe almost as much honor bestowed on him as Harry Barnes; for they are the people that made this club what it is today.
