Clearing Sn 🔅 w Studebaker Style

Northern Indiana winters can be bitter cold and very snowy, especially in South Bend. Winds blowing off the frigid waters of Lake Michigan can blow a few inches of snow into towering drifts. Therefore South Bend's hometown automobile manufacturer was tapped to design and

build Ice Dozers for military use. As you can see from the detailed drawing, the Studebaker engineers were right on target and provided a very well built and dependable vehicle.

The T-15 Snow Weasel was manufactured in it's unique white paint scheme specifically for the U.S. military during WWII. It was used on commando missions in Norway to make sure Germany wasn't installing any atomic weapons.



With a Studebaker Model 6-170 Champion 6-cylinder engine located in the back and the driver in the front, this bad boy had an operating range of a mere 165 miles at 36 mph—but it was enough. They didn't necessarily need to be fast so much as they needed to be strong, and they served that purpose well.

The initial M29 Weasel that was built by Studebaker wasn't outfitted in the white paint scheme. It was just standard old military green.

Weasels were used all over the world, including Britain, France, and Canada—but the T-15 winter prototype was only used in Norway.



Meanwhile, back home people were struggling with daily living. Most families only owned one vehicle. There was not availability, nor finances, to have a truck and a family car.

Well, as they say..."where there's a need there's a way"...and someone at Eshelman designed a snowplow that could be mounted on a car. Yes! While Dad was away fighting in the war, Mom and Junior could turn their trusty Studebaker into a reliable vehicle to plow snow!
