
The Hospitality Room needs to be stocked with pre-packaged snacks.

"Spring F@rward

People have strong feelings about Daylight Saving Time...they either love it or hate it. In Indiana, we have 8 months of DST as opposed to only 4 months of Standard Time. But whether you are for or against this time revolution, it has a very long and interesting history.

During WWI, Germany was the first to adopt DST. Their officials believed the extra daylight hour would help save precious fuel, which was needed to produce weapons and bombs. Seeing some validity to this thinking, soon

- •It's Daylight Saving Time not "savings" time.
- •Ben Franklin did not invent it. Though in 1774 he did suggest getting people up earlier as a way to save money on candles.
- First implemented in 1909 during WWI as a way to save energy for war production. It was also referred to as "war time".
- Hawaii and Arizona (except for the Navajo Nation) do not observe it.
- •It's used in over 70 countries around the world though dates and times vary.

Britain and America also adopted the custom. However, the idea proved to be very unpopular (especially with American dairy farmers) and once the war ended, U.S. lawmakers stopped the clock manipulation.

During WWII, President Franklin D. Roosevelt's "War Time" bill reinstated DST in 1942. But after the war ended, "War Time" was revoked on September 2, 1945. However, cities and towns were allowed to continue the tradition and even select their own DST start and stop dates.

The lack of consistency resulted in a "chaos of clocks" in 1963. The Uniform Time Act of 1966 resolved the issue by setting specific start and end dated to be followed countrywide. In the beginning DST started on the last Sunday in April and ended on the final Sunday in October. Over the years, these start and stop dates have evolved and in 2005, our current schedule was approved by Congress. Now DST starts on the second Sunday in March and ends the first Sunday in November.





Though DST has been a fixture on the American calendar for decades, many Americans still do not like the idea of changing our clocks. The anti-DST folks point to sleep deprivation that leads to a loss in productivity and more traffic and workplace accidents. The twice-a-year change has also been linked to health issues.

However businesses, sporting events, golf courses, and restaurants assert that the longer evenings encourage consumers to leave their homes and spend money. This sentiment seems to be shared by U.S. lawmakers, who have rejected many petitions to get rid of DST. So, it looks like Daylight Saving Time is here to stay!


