We have enough signed up for tours that the buses are paid for with a little left over for the Club.

Swap Meet Chair, **Marvin Snider** reported all indoor vendor spaces are sold out -147, and an additional 35 outdoor spaces have been sold.

We currently have \$13,629 in the International Meet bank account, however, we will now start paying out expenses such as the vest and t-shirts, etc.

The dash plaques are in. **Nancy Bacon** had people interested in International Meet coffee mugs. She had twenty four made at \$7.99 our cost and will sell the mugs at the Meet for \$12.00. Several were sold at the recent SDC meeting.

WiFi – the Club has to rent the WiFi and see to it that it will be located where needed. **Jeff Westcott** will do the setting up. Jeff informed the Club that there will **be limited access to the WiFi and for members not to expect to download it.**

Jeff Westcott has also graciously agreed to be the office photographer as the original photographer is from Canada and could not guarantee attending.

Becky Griffith will publish a listing of the Chairpersons with cell phone number and e-mail address, and a map of the fairgrounds. This map will be slightly different than the one given to registrants.

Covid - Mask will not be mandatory, *however*, we will provide 1000 masks, and sanitizer. Sanitizer will also be in registrant's gift bags.



been dearly cherished by the recipient.


- 3. **Greeting Cards** Even in today's fast-paced technology world, we all still love to give and receive a birthday card!
