
Nancy asked Chuck Kern for an update on Ted Harbit: Ted's nickname is "The Captain" for over 50 years active


**Andy Hess** continues his battle with non-small cell lung cancer that has metastasized in the brain. Please keep Andy and Cathy in your prayers.


